

Re: Provisional Level IIIB Perinatal Referral Center Designation

Dear Dr. Taneja,

MIEMSS appreciates the effort and cooperation that Prince George's Hospital Center (PGHC) extended to the MIEMSS Perinatal Program staff and DHMH staff who visited your campus recently for a Perinatal Referral Center follow-up site survey visit.

As you know, on August 27, 2013, MIEMSS designated PGHC as a Level IIIB Perinatal Referral Center on a one (1) year provisional basis, to be followed by four (4) years of probation. As a condition of this designation, PGHC developed and submitted to MIEMSS a written work plan to rectify deficiencies identified during the initial site visit.

The purpose of the follow-up site survey visit several weeks ago was to review, validate the implementation and gauge the progress of PGHC's corrective action plan in addressing areas of non-compliance with the perinatal standards specified in COMAR 30.08.12 et seq. At the site visit, the reviewers found that PGHC has demonstrated the required progress on the work plan throughout the provisional period as required by COMAR 30.08.02.07 and currently complies with the requirements for Level IIIB Perinatal Referral Center designation.

Therefore, MIEMSS has determined to remove PGHC's provisional status and to maintain PGHC's designation status on probation for the remainder of the four-year designation cycle.

Please be advised that in order to ensure ongoing compliance with the corrective action plan, MIEMSS and DHMH will conduct follow-up site survey visits at six-month intervals throughout the remainder of the four-year designation cycle. Should PGHC demonstrate continual ongoing compliance and sustainability in meeting the perinatal standards, we will evaluate the need to continue with the six-month follow-up visits.

Thank you for your efforts over the past year to bring PGHC into compliance with State requirements for Level IIIB perinatal centers. We look forward to continuing to work with you and your staff.
