

Responsibilities of Chief of Cardiac Surgery Ann Arundel Medical Center

1. This individual will have overall responsibility for the AAMC program and will be directly answerable to the Chief, Division of Cardiac Surgery; Chairman Department of Surgery at JHU as well as Chief, Department of Surgery Ann Arundel Medical Center.
2. This individual will spend 80- 90% of his clinical time in activities related to the program at AAMC.
3. This individual will maintain operative privileges at JHH and will have block time at JHH 2 days a month to maintain the continuity with the JHH program.
4. This individual will be responsible for the daily management of the cardiac surgery service including but not limited to:
 - a. The evaluation and acceptance of patients for cardiac surgery
 - b. Performing Cardiac Surgery
 - c. Supervising the post operative management of cardiac surgery patients.
5. This individual will be responsible for maintaining a schedule of cardiac surgery attending physicians 24 x 7.
6. This individual will be responsible for design and implementation of cardiac surgery protocols at AAMC.
7. This individual will be responsible for direct oversight of cardiac surgery attending clinical outcomes and professionalism along with the JHU Chief of Cardiac Surgery.
8. This individual will be responsible for providing programmatic oversight to the AAMC based perfusionists along with the JHU chief of Cardiac Surgery and JHU Chief of Perfusion Services.
9. This individual will be responsible for providing programmatic oversight to the AAMC based physician / surgical assistants along with the JHU chief of Cardiac Surgery and JHU Chief of physician / surgical assistants.
10. This individual will be responsible for providing oversight to cardiac surgery outcomes including a cardiac surgery specific morbidity and mortality program separate and in conjunction with that of JHU.
11. This individual will be responsible for providing oversight to cardiac surgery specific quality improvement initiatives separate and in conjunction with that of JHU.
12. This individual will work with AAMC leadership to provide Cardiac Surgery specific community outreach programs in program development, education and fund raising.
13. This individual will work with AAMC cardiology and anesthesia leadership to maintain a seamless integration of cardiology and anesthesia services as they pertain to the performance of cardiac surgery.
14. This individual will help coordinate the training of AAMC staff at JHU for the clinical program at AAMC.
15. This individual will help develop and coordinate cardiac surgery clinical research activities.
16. This individual will supervise JHU medical student, resident , fellowship level trainees as they rotate on the Cardiac Surgery service at AAMC.
17. This individual will supervise students and trainees from non-physician medical disciplines as they rotate on the Cardiac Surgery service at AAMC.

18. This individual will fulfill medical staff requirements to maintain privileges in good standing at both AAMC and JHH.
