Howard County Department of Social Services is a relatively small agency with an average annual census of <60 children and youth in Out-of-Home placement. Of these children and youth, less than 20% would be recommended or require RTC level of care. Inclusion of a range of assessments would be beneficial beyond the routine psychiatric and psychosocial to include options for psychological testing and psychosexual evaluations by skilled clinicians in this area of specialty practice.

A program offering a range of treatment options such as short-term diagnostic services, RTC based residential & educational services, RTC based residential with community-based public education, and flexible partial RTC placement with partial home-based or community based care would be ideal.

Overall, the cases that we have the most difficulty with are those of traumatized females. There does not appear to be a RTC placement that focuses primarily on trauma for females 13-21. Additionally, once a youth turns 18 it is nearly impossible to find a RTC placement even if the recommendations state that the youth needs this level of placement. Often times these individuals are placed in juvenile detention centers or in environments that are unable to provide them with the services that they need.
