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Annual Report on Selected Maryland Acute Care Hospital Services: Fiscal Year 2012

Background

An Annual Report profiling changes in licensed acute care hospital beds in Maryland's acute care hospitals was initiated in 2001 to document and track changes in the licensed bed inventory following implementation of a standardized annual licensure renewal process based on inpatient census. The process involves notifying hospitals prior to the beginning of each fiscal year concerning the calculated total number of licensed acute care beds for the coming fiscal year. In turn, the hospitals identify the allocation of the total licensed acute care beds across four service categories: medical/surgical/gynecological/addictions ("MSGA"); obstetric, pediatric, and acute psychiatric services. Over time, additional information on hospital service capacity, covering emergency department services, surgical services, obstetric and perinatal services, and non-acute care bed capacity have been added to the survey undertaken to update acute care bed licensure. This *Annual Report on Selected Maryland Acute Care Hospital Services: Fiscal Year 2012* has been prepared by the Maryland Health Care Commission's Center for Hospital Services.

Acute Care Hospital Bed Capacity

Licensed bed capacity for acute care hospitals in the State of Maryland is dynamic, calculated annually based on average daily acute care inpatient census. The Maryland Health Care Commission, in conjunction with the Health Services Cost Review Commission, calculates the average daily census of acute care patients for each hospital for the 12-month period ending with the first quarter of each year and total licensed acute care bed capacity is established for the next fiscal year at 140% of the hospital's average daily census. This licensure approach reflects an assumption that an average annual occupancy rate of approximately 71.4% for acute care hospital beds is an appropriate bench-mark for determining the maximum number of beds an acute care hospital needs to operate.

The initial implementation of this licensure process in 2001 resulted in a statewide reduction in licensed acute care hospital beds of 2,773 beds. However, total licensed acute care beds increased each year following the initial reduction in 2001 until fiscal year 2011. Statewide, the total number of licensed acute care hospital beds decreased by 151 beds in FY2011. Fiscal Year 2012 also shows a decline in licensed acute care hospital beds with a decrease of 146 beds.

The annual increase from FY 2001 to FY 2010 in total licensed beds ranged from less than 1% to 2.5%. In FY 2011 and FY 2012, licensed inventory of acute care beds, statewide, decreased by 1.4%.

Non-acute care beds located in acute care hospitals are excluded from this annual licensure adjustment process, as are special hospitals. Beginning in 2008, the Commission surveyed special hospitals to include inventories of "special hospital" beds (rehabilitation, chronic care, and long term psychiatric care) in this report, including special hospital beds located on or off general acute care hospital campuses

Licensed Acute Care Hospital Beds in Maryland: FY 2012

Table 1 shows the licensed acute care bed capacity for each acute care hospital, by service, effective July 1, 2011. The calculation of licensed beds for FY2012 based on each hospital's average daily census from April 1, 2010 through March 31, 2011, results in a total of 10,583 licensed acute care hospital beds in Maryland. Table 2 shows a ten-year trend in licensed acute care beds by hospital. Table 3 shows the percent change by region.






Figure 2. Total Licensed Acute Care Beds: Maryland Hospitals, FY 2001 - 2012




Figure 3. Trend in Average Daily Acute Care Patient Census: Maryland Hospitals, CY 1980 - 2010

While the average daily census of acute care patients gradually trended upward since the late 1990's, hospital utilization in Maryland has remained below historic peaks. During calendar year 2009 average daily census saw the first decline since dynamic hospital bed licensure went into effect in 2001. The average daily census declined again in calendar year 2010. Figure 3 shows the trend of declining acute care census from the early 1980s through the late 1990s, the extent of the rebound in census that occurred in the next ten years and now a decline during the 2009 and 2010 calendar years.

Table 4 profiles the FY 2011 - 2012 change in total licensed acute care hospital beds from a regional perspective. While the State as a whole saw an overall decrease of 1.4% in bed capacity, three of Maryland's health planning regions saw an overall increase in bed capacity. Central Maryland and the Eastern Shore accounted for the statewide decline in FY2012. Statewide, thirteen hospitals saw an increase in bed capacity, thirty-one hospitals saw a decrease in bed capacity and two hospitals had no change in bed capacity from the previous year.

Table 5 profiles the change in the inventory of licensed acute care hospital beds for the past 10 fiscal years for the four acute care bed service categories. The MSGA bed category had a sustained increase in the allocation of licensed bed capacity until the last two fiscal years. Obstetric beds declined in FY2011 but returned to the FY2010 level in FY2012. Pediatric bed capacity decreased by 5 allocated beds in FY2012. The acute psychiatric bed capacity allocation increased for FY2012, continuing a pattern of gradual increase in allocation since 2007.

Table 6 shows the FY 2012 inventory of critical care beds, which, in the case of adult critical care beds, are a subset of MSGA beds. Adult critical care beds comprise 15.4% of the state's licensed MSGA bed inventory, ranging from just over 9% in Western Maryland to 16.6% and 16.5% of licensed MSGA beds, respectively, in Montgomery County and Central Maryland. Pediatric critical care beds comprise 14.8% of the State's licensed pediatric bed inventory.

Table 7 identifies the proportion of total licensed acute care beds, by hospital, which the hospital identified as equipped with cardiac monitoring. Monitorable means that cardiac monitoring is available for identified hospital beds. Previously this meant a bed was hard-wired for cardiac monitoring. With the institution of centralized monitoring, a wireless transmitting system that can be viewed on a central surveillance system, cardiac monitoring is no longer dependent on a stationary bed being hard wired. Wireless monitoring can detect early warning signs and changes in a patient's condition through the continuous automated collection of key vital signs.

From 2007 to 2011, the number of monitored beds reported by Maryland's acute care general hospitals increased 32%, this compares to the 18%, increase from 2007 to 2010, in part due to the increase of monitoring capability with the wireless centralized systems. While monitored beds as a percentage of all licensed beds, from 2007 to 2010 increased an average of 5.6% per year, in 2011, the increase in monitorable beds was 11%. The number of monitorable beds reported by Maryland's acute care hospitals increased from 45% of total licensed beds in 2010 to 51% in 2011.

In addition to collecting monitorable bed inventories for licensed acute care beds, MHCC also compiles that data for bassinets for hospitals that provide obstetrical and newborn nursery services. Thirty-four hospitals provide obstetric and perinatal services and report a combined total of 1,394 newborn nursery bassinets; of these bassinets, 506 have monitoring capability,

*Meritus Medical Center, in addition to 99 hard wired monitored beds, added 80 beds with centralized remote monitoring bringing the total of monitored beds to 179. Peninsula Regional implemented a remote continuous monitoring system that provides EKG monitoring for 345 beds, the system does not include 8 pediatric and 10 psychiatric beds that are not capable of centralized monitoring at this time.

Table 8 profiles the trend in licensed acute care beds for hospitals that are members of multihospital systems and for hospitals that are independent. Fifty seven percent (57%) of Maryland's acute care general hospitals are part of the state's seven multihospital systems.




Figure 4. Multihospital System Hospitals,and Non-System Hospitals and Beds, Maryland, 2003 - 2012

Figure 4 shows the number of Maryland hospitals and beds that are part of a multihospital system and the number of hospitals and beds that are not part of a multihospital system in Maryland. Although there was little change from 2001 through 2007, 2009 through 2011 shows an increase in the number of hospitals joining multihospital systems.

Table 9 compares the growth and annual change in the number of hospitals and beds that are part of Maryland multihospital systems with hospitals that are independent, reflecting the annual percent change in the distribution of beds and the change during the last ten years (FY2003 to FY2012).

Total Available Acute Care Bed Capacity

The Commission surveys hospitals for the total number of acute care beds they could physically accommodate, if necessary. Available acute care bed capacity is defined as the total number of acute inpatient beds that are available for use, or that could be physically set up in space appropriate for licensed acute inpatient care, as admissions might warrant. It is a physical count of beds based on the available patient rooms with headwalls, measuring the maximum operating capacity under normal, non-emergency circumstances, rather than a measure of staffing capacity.

The survey shows that 33 general hospitals in Maryland with 5,547 licensed acute care beds report the availability of physical bed capacity that exceeds their licensed capacity. These 33 hospitals, in the aggregate, report a physical capacity for 6,792 beds. This excess physical bed capacity (1,245 beds) would potentially be available to accommodate short term growth in demand and, if necessary, major emergencies and disasters, so long as staffing resources could be secured. The Central Maryland region has the greatest excess, with reported physical bed capacity exceeding licensed bed capacity by 583 beds, followed by Southern Maryland with 210 more physical beds than licensed beds.

Nine hospitals report that their physical capacity for acute care beds, as of June, 2011, is less than their licensed bed capacity. These hospitals have a combined total of 3,793 licensed acute care beds and report that, in the aggregate, they only have physical capacity to set up 3,571 acute care beds, a shortfall of 222 beds.¹

Statewide, the Commission's June 1, 2011 survey identifies a net of 1,023 beds of physical bed capacity in excess of licensed bed capacity. The results of this survey are shown in Table10.²

¹ Two of these hospitals have CON-approved projects underway that may affect their ability to ultimately reduce the reported gap between licensed acute care bed capacity and the acute care bed capacity they can physically set up and staff.

 $^{^2}$ The data are self reported and not verified by the Commission. To the extent possible, the Commission verifies hospital physical bed capacity on a case by case basis, when reviewing hospital expansion, renovation, and replacement projects submitted under the Certificate of Need Program.

Emergency Department/ Freestanding Medical Facility (FMF) Treatment Capacity

Maryland has 45 emergency departments located in acute care hospitals and additional emergency treatment spaces at three freestanding medical facilities operated by hospital organizations that provide emergency services.³ Bowie Health Center, located in Prince George's County, has 21 treatment spaces allocated to emergency care. The Shady Grove Emergency Center at Germantown in Montgomery County also has 21 treatment spaces. The Queen Anne's Emergency Center, under the authority of Memorial Hospital of Easton, opened in late 2010, adding 14 emergency center treatment spaces to the Eastern Shore.

Table 11 shows the change in emergency treatment capacity from a regional perspective. Eight (8) emergency departments increased capacity and the Queen Anne's Freestanding Medical Facility opened in 2010, adding 21 emergency treatment spaces to the Eastern Shore. Four emergency departments showed a decline in the number of treatment spaces from 2010 to 2011. Overall Maryland emergency departments/facilities reported an increase of 43 (2.2%) treatment spaces.




Figure 5. Change in Number of Emergency Treatment Spaces by Type of Space: Maryland, 2005 - 2011

Hospital Surgical Services Capacity

Table 14 displays the inventory of sterile operating rooms, by room type, excluding dedicated cesarean section rooms. Table 15 profiles the inventory of dedicated cesarean section operating rooms and procedure rooms. Procedure rooms are rooms used for endoscopy, cystoscopy, or other minor procedures and many are not sterile rooms, and thus, are only appropriately used for "closed" procedures that do not involve surgical incisions.

<u>Special Hospital Services, Comprehensive Care Facilities in the Hospital Setting, and</u> <u>Hospital-Based Psychiatric Inpatient Care</u>

Special hospitals are facilities that have an organized medical staff of physicians and that include inpatient beds with medical services. The medical services include physician services and continuous registered professional nursing services, for not less than 24 hours every day, to provide diagnosis and treatment for patients who have specific medical conditions. In Maryland, special hospitals provide specialized rehabilitation, chronic care, pediatric and psychiatric services. Special hospital beds may be located on the campus of an acute general hospital. In these cases, they are separately licensed from acute care beds. Special hospital beds are not included in the annual licensure process for acute care beds located in acute care general hospitals. Thus, there should be no difference between licensed bed inventories and physical bed capacity, in the case of such beds.

Special Hospital Medical Rehabilitation Services

Acute inpatient rehabilitation is defined, at COMAR 10.24.09, as interdisciplinary care provided to persons with disabilities who are at high risk of potential medical instability, have a potential for needing skilled nursing care of a high medical acuity, and require a mix of services, service intensity levels, and settings of the following type:

- 1. Regular, direct individual contact by a physiatrist or physician of equivalent training and/or experience in rehabilitation who serves as their lead provider;
- 2. Daily rehabilitation nursing for multiple and/or complex needs;
- 3. A minimum of three hours of physical or occupational therapy per day, at least five days per week, in addition to therapies or services from a psychologist, a social worker, a speech-language pathologist, and a therapeutic recreation specialist, as determined by the individual needs; or
- 4. Based on their individual needs, other services provided in a health care facility that is licensed as a hospital.

There are five (5) special hospitals licensed to provide medical rehabilitation services in Maryland and eleven (11) Maryland acute care hospitals have special hospital units that provide medical rehabilitation services. Table 18 profiles the types of rehabilitation programs offered at these facilities, the number of licensed beds, and the number of licensed beds that are regularly staffed. Staffed beds are defined as the number of beds regularly maintained (set up and staffed for use) for inpatients. In this table, adult patients are defined as 18 years of age and older and pediatric patients are patients under the age of 18. The program listings are medical rehabilitation services that are accredited by the Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities (CARF). CARF is an independent nonprofit accrediting body of human service providers in the areas of aging services, behavioral health, child and youth services, durable medical equipment, prosthetics, orthotics and orthotic supplies, employment and community

services, medical rehabilitation, and opioid treatment programs. CARF accreditation is required by the State of Maryland for licensure of rehabilitation facilities.

Other Special Hospital Services (non-psychiatric)

Pediatric

Facilities with beds licensed as Special Hospital – Pediatric are used to provide specialized inpatient services to patients less than 18 years of age. There are two special hospitals in Maryland dedicated to providing specialized pediatric services. Both hospitals provide rehabilitation and other special hospital services and are located in Baltimore City. (See Table 20.)

Chronic Care

Facilities with beds licensed as Special Hospital - Chronic provide continuous and intensive medical, nursing, and ancillary services to medically-complex patients with severe illness who require close professional monitoring and observation and frequent medical interventions, either after an acute hospital phase of care or as a result of acute exacerbations of illness while residing in other settings, such as the patient's home or a nursing home (comprehensive care facility).

Four special hospital facilities in Maryland are licensed to provide special hospital-chronic care and these facilities have a total of 406 licensed beds, of which 283 are reported to be regularly staffed. The four special hospitals providing chronic care range in size from 60 to 180 licensed beds. Two chronic hospitals are private, and two are state-operated. The two private chronic special hospitals are located in the Central Maryland region. The two state operated

chronic hospitals are each located in the less densely populated Health Planning Regions of Western Maryland and the Eastern Shore. Additionally three acute care hospitals, two located in Baltimore City and one in Prince George's County, the Southern Maryland region, provide chronic special hospital services. The two Central Maryland Hospitals have a total of 100 licensed chronic care beds located on their campuses, which are staffed to licensed capacity. The acute care hospital in Southern Maryland is licensed for 46 chronic care beds and also is staffed to licensed capacity. Chronic beds located on an acute care hospital campus are licensed separately and are not part of the annual acute care bed licensure process. Tables 19 and 20 show the licensed capacity of individual hospitals and the number of beds regularly staffed, by jurisdiction and region.

Comprehensive Care Facility Beds in the Hospital Setting

Comprehensive care facilities ("CCFs") are licensed in accordance with COMAR 10.07.02. These facilities admit patients suffering from disease or disabilities, or advanced age, requiring medical service and nursing service rendered by or under the supervision of a registered nurse. The vast bulk of CCF services are provided in Maryland through freestanding (non-hospital) CCFs, commonly known as nursing homes. Only 2.8% of the state's total CCF beds are located in general or special hospital settings. However, this type of inpatient facility service is also offered by 10 acute care general hospitals (Table 22) and by four facilities that combine special hospital comprehensive care facility services (Table 23) with chronic care services (Table 20). CCF beds in general hospitals are primarily used to provide short-term rehabilitative services to Medicare patients. In contrast, most of the state's CCF beds are used in providing longer-term chronic and custodial care.

Psychiatric Hospital Facilities and Services

In Maryland, two types of hospital-level inpatient psychiatric services are provided; acute psychiatric services and longer-term, continuing care. Most acute inpatient psychiatric care is provided within the acute care general hospital setting at 28 acute care general hospitals. These psychiatric beds are included in the annual "dynamic" licensure process for all acute care beds located in acute care general hospitals, in which the licensed acute care bed inventory is based on recorded average daily census. Hospital-level psychiatric inpatient care outside of the acute care general hospital setting can be found in freestanding private hospitals or in state hospitals. The psychiatric beds in these two types of facility types are licensed as a category of "special hospital" bed under the State's licensing statute. Freestanding private psychiatric hospitals primarily provide acute psychiatric inpatient services. State psychiatric hospitals primarily provide long-term, continuing care psychiatric inpatient services.

Table 24 provides an overview of the acute psychiatric inpatient service bed capacity and program characteristics of general acute care hospitals. In general, services for children are provided to a patient population under the age of 13 years, adolescent services are provided to patients aged 13 to 17, and adult services are provided to patients aged 18 years and older.

Table 25 identifies the licensed bed capacity and the number of reported regularly staffed beds at Maryland's five freestanding private psychiatric hospitals. Table 26 identifies the number of licensed beds and "budgeted" beds, at Maryland's five state-operated psychiatric hospitals. The Upper Shore Community Health Center, a state operated psychiatric hospital, located in Kent County, closed its psychiatric bed capacity on January 4, 2010. The number of "budgeted" beds provides a more accurate reflection of the bed capacity that is typically set up and staffed at these facilities than the number of licensed beds.

Partial Hospitalization Programs (PHP) and Intensive Outpatient Programs (IOP) for psychiatric patients are also provided in the acute care general hospital setting and the special hospital setting. PHPs and IOPs are organized day or night programs providing assessment, treatment, habilitation, or rehabilitation services for persons who do not require psychiatric inpatient care on a 24-hour basis. This may be a structured, ongoing program that the patient typically attends 2 to 5 times a week for 2 to 5 hours per day providing clinical behavioral health services. The plan of care is prescribed by and overseen by a psychiatrist. PHPs may be used as a "step-down" from inpatient care or a "step-up" from less intensive outpatient programming and are sometimes called "day hospital" programs. Services are usually provided in a group setting for at least 4 hours of direct clinical care per day, with additional individual and/or family therapy and medication management as needed. IOPs are a subset of PHPs and would typically involve fewer sessions per week and/or fewer hours per daily session. IOPs may be used as a "step-down" from PHPs or a "step-up" from less intensive outpatient generation as a subset of the institutional setting.

MHCC surveyed the availability of PHPs and IOPs at hospitals, requesting information on the maximum number of treatment "slots" available and the daily program census on four specific dates between September, 2010 and June, 2011. Tables 27 and 28 profile these programs as offered in 22 acute care general hospitals and five freestanding private psychiatric hospitals, respectively. State-operated psychiatric hospitals do not provide PHP or IOP services. [NOTE: Average daily census is

the average number of patients based on patient census for four specific dates between September, 2010 and June, 2011, as reported by each hospital.]
