

Overlapping Advisory Group Issues (Vulnerable Populations & Transportation and Access to Care)

Problem: Transportation is a problem in the Mid-Eastern Shore Region due to long distances to services and/or heavy traffic during certain times. In addition, vulnerable populations (including low income, minorities, elderly, children, unemployed, uninsured, and individuals with chronic illnesses or mental health disorders) often lack access to transportation. When individuals lack transportation for health care, they may be more non-compliant with physician visits and medications. There is also greater use of the ED for non-emergent care and use of ambulance services for routine services.

The following chart contains **overlapping** ideas, solutions and challenges as discussed by the two Advisory Groups:
