4	Health professional productivity, resources and shortages; underserved population areas <u>Discussion items:</u> Increasing access to health care services through telehealth (underserved, both urban and rural); recruitment and retention	Identify strategies for telehealth deployment to meet any increased demand for health care due to the implementation of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act <u>Discussion items:</u> Use cases under consideration by the CAG
