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# What is health equity?

MDPCP adopts the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation definition of health equity:

**Health equity** means that everyone has a fair and just opportunity to be as healthy as possible. This requires removing obstacles to health such as poverty, discrimination, and their consequences, including powerlessness and lack of access to good jobs with fair pay, quality education and housing, safe environments, and health care

For the purposes of measurement, health equity means reducing and ultimately eliminating disparities in health and its determinants that adversely affect excluded or marginalized groups.



# **Current State of MDPCP Equity Strategies**



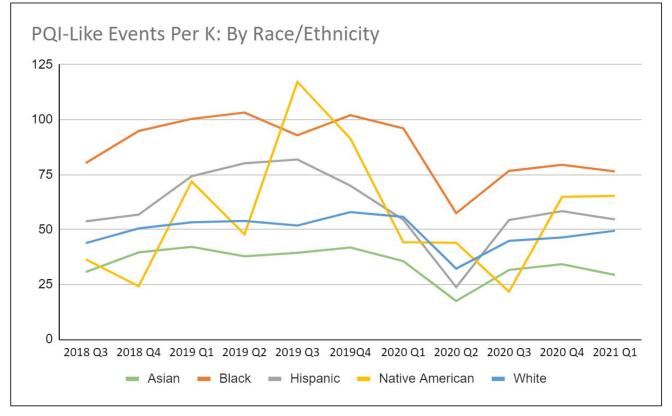
- Most proposed strategies are preliminary and this is the discovery phase

### **MDPCP Health Equity Goals**

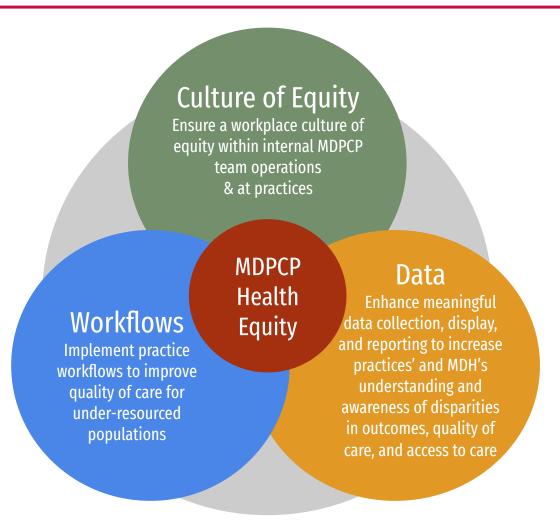
Achieve equitable quality of care, access to services, and health outcomes in MDPCP practices

- 1. Reduce the gap in PQI-like events per K between racial/ethnic populations, while improving outcomes across all populations
- Understand and analyze any disparities in PBIP clinical quality measures
- 3. Distribute Covid vaccine to primary care practices to achieve more equitable vaccine distribution

Overview

MDPCP offers a robust learning system. We can ensure an equity lens is a part of every training put out by MDPCP

Develop a core set of materials for MDPCP equity work including: defining health equity in MDPCP, core equity principles in MDPCP Work with CMS to implement equity focus in CMS documents.

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- Communicate to practices that health equity is a core focus of MDPCP
- Demonstrate how health disparities affect all areas of MDPCP work
- Come to a common understanding of health equity and equity goals with MDPCP practices



# **Culture of Equity**

Overview

Internal trainings on equitable workplaces can support transforming MDPCP's workplace culture

Being culturally competent and aware of implicit bias is important for providers serving diverse populations. MDPCP can recommend existing trainings or institute a custom curriculum

Ultimately, the primary way to communicate priorities is through ties to funding. MDPCP can recommend to CMS an

equity-based performance measure for the PBIP that incentivizes practices to work to reduce disparities.

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- •Incorporate principles of equitable workplace culture into MDPCP team
- •Be a model for practices (e.g. 100% of PMO staff trained in cultural competency)
- Ensure providers are practicing cultural competence/humility in their patient care

Overview

About \( \frac{1}{3} \) adults have limited health literacy, and practice communications may only be accessible to those that have high health literacy or education levels. Supporting practices in creating accessible materials and oral communication will help serve this population.

Care management is one of the core MDPCP interventions, however it is not known which patients most receive this support. Breaking down who receives care management will bring to light any disparities in access to care, leading towards more equitable solutions.

Screening for social needs is an MDPCP Track 2 requirement, however not all MDPCP practices use best practice screening workflows.

Create a playbook for implementing best practice social needs screening workflows and EMR documentation

Purpose

Ensure that written and oral communication to patients is understandable and accessible to patients with limited health literacy

- Understand any disparities in access to care management
- If disparities exist, support practices in building a more equitable care management strategy and coming up with strategies to reach more patients

Overview

A language access plan is a plan that lays out how a site will provide services for people with limited English proficiency. Creating a language access plan will ensure practices provide quality care for this population.

CHW programs are often implemented as best practice for reducing health disparities and include direct community engagement. This project would create a playbook of best practices for practices to meaningfully incorporate CHWs into the practice care team.

This project would support the creation of a robust and meaningful online resource directory for community-based organizations that can help support patients' social needs.

Purpose

•Ensure all practice services are provided to people with limited English proficiency

- •Improve health outcomes in targeted communities through strategic deployment of CHWs and integration of CHWs into MDPCP care teams
- •Understand how CHWs are used in MDPCP practices today

•Create a state source of information for referral organizations to help address patients' social needs

# Overview

Display common MDPCP claims metrics (PQI-like events, utilization, PMPM) broken down by demographic groups in the CRS reporting suite.

When disaggregating metrics, it is important to understand what is signal and what is noise, as well as understand how to interpret and make best use of data.

# Purpose

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• Allow practices to understand disparities in common MDPCP claims measures for continued exploration and intervention

 Support practices in knowing how to interpret data, identify disparities, and know where to start and where to focus

#### **Data**

Goal: Enhance meaningful data collection, display, and reporting to increase practices' and MDH's understanding and awareness of disparities in outcomes, quality of care, and access to care.

\*Quality Data Extraction and Disaggregation

Self-reported demographic data collection best practices support

Overview

Implement a platform for statewide ambulatory quality data extraction, with particular focus on patient-level demographic data breakdowns

Support best practices for:

- 1. having race, ethnicity, language, gender identity, sexual orientation, etc. preference conversations with patients
- 2. discrete demographic data element collection in the EMR

Purpose

 Understand disparities in clinical quality outcomes at the practice, regional, and state levels

- Improve data quality for future meaningful report breakdown (garbage in, garbage out)
- Improve practices' ability to hold and document conversations with patients about self-reported demographic information
