Dear Mr. Steffen,

As you are aware, on March 5, 2020, Governor Hogan issued a proclamation that a state of emergency and a catastrophic health emergency exists in Maryland, due to the COVID-19 outbreak. Based on the increased need for acute general hospital beds due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Office of Health Care Quality is requesting that the Maryland Health Care Commission apply its authority under COMAR 10.24.01.20 to grant an emergency certificate of need to general hospitals that have agreed to the installation and operation of 8-bed intensive care unit (ICU) modular buildings on the hospital grounds and that are listed on a spreadsheet maintained by the Department of General Services in coordination with the Maryland Emergency Management Agency.

Each 8-bed modular ICU building will be located on the general hospital's campus. Each modular ICU building will be appropriately equipped with utilities and emergency power and will be constructed over the next few weeks.

The Office of Health Care Quality recommends that these certificates of need should be approved on an emergency basis. Each modular 8-bed ICU building can be provisionally licensed as part of the licensure of each hospital for the term of the state of emergency.
