The Process for Establishing a Home Health Agency (HHA)

Consistent with the HHA Chapter's regulations regarding determination of need for additional HHAs (COMAR 10.24.16.04), MHCC staff monitors for each county/jurisdiction whether it has sufficient consumer choice of HHAs, a competitive market, and sufficient choice of HHAs with high-quality performance. Staff conduct such reviews at the time the most recent HHA utilization data becomes available, based on the submission of data from all Maryland HHAs on the MHCC HHA Annual Survey. In addition, MHCC staff monitor CMS's HHA quality metrics and performance scores based on the most recent CMS data available.

As required by the HHA Chapter regulations (COMAR 10.24.16.07), when one or more jurisdictions have been identified for additional HHA services (consistent with the need determination regulations), MHCC staff publishes in a public notice draft quality measures and required performance levels for those quality measures that must be achieved by an applicant to be considered in the review cycle. The Commission considers the comments and staff's recommendations in establishing the applicable quality measures and performance levels for a given review cycle.

A CON review schedule was published in the Maryland Register on July 11, 2025. There was no need identified under insufficient choice; however consistent with the HHA Chapter of the State Health Plan (COMAR 10.24.16.04), multiple jurisdictions qualify as having a need for additional HHA services under two other areas. First, the qualifying counties under a highly concentrated market include Allegany, Calvert, Caroline, Cecil, Charles, Dorchester, Garrett, Kent, Queen Anne's, St. Mary's, Somerset, Talbot, Washington, Wicomico and Worchester. Second, the qualifying counties under insufficient choice of quality performing home health agencies (based on proposed quality metrics) are Anne Arundel, Baltimore, Carroll, Charles, Frederick, Garrett, Harford, Howard, Montgomery, Prince George's, St. Mary's and Wicomico. The jurisdiction of Baltimore City also qualifies under insufficient choice.

Below is the schedule that the Commission has published for submitting Certificate of Need applications for home health agencies. This schedule outlines the key dates and for applicants to ensure a smooth and compliant application process. We encourage all interested parties to review the schedule carefully and prepare their submissions accordingly to meet the outlined deadlines. Your cooperation is essential in facilitating timely evaluations and approvals.
