The number of licensed chronic hospital beds maintained in the Commission's inventory is based on the Commission's Certificate of Need files and licensing information provided by the Office of Health Care Quality. The number of FY 2015 patient days for the private chronic hospitals is obtained from the Health Services Cost Review Commission's Chronic Care Confidential File. The number of FY 2015 patient days for the two state-operated chronic hospitals is obtained from the Hospital Management Information System (HMIS), as maintained by the Maryland Department of Health and Mental Hygiene.

Notes: The number of beds reflects the number of licensed chronic hospital beds at each facility as of June 30, 2015 (the end of the 2015 fiscal year reporting period). Occupancy is calculated based on licensed beds.

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¹ University of Maryland Rehabilitation and Orthopedic Institute's 52 chronic hospital beds include 16 dually licensed chronic/rehabilitation beds.

² Western Maryland Hospital Center's occupancy rate, based on its 20 *budgeted* chronic hospital beds, would be 86.3 percent.

³ Deer's Head Hospital Center's chronic hospital occupancy rate, based on its 11 *budgeted* chronic hospital beds, would be 70.1 percent.

⁴ The occupancy rate for the two State-operated chronic hospitals, based on the total 31 *budgeted* chronic hospital beds, would be 80.6 percent.

⁵ The statewide chronic hospital occupancy rate, based on the 354 *licensed* beds at the five *private* facilities plus the 31 *budgeted* beds at the two *state-operated* facilities would be 68.5 percent.
