Background – State Law



Chapter 790/791, Public Health – State Designated Exchange – Clinical Information (2021)

- ► Requires electronic health networks (EHN) to provide electronic health care transactions to the State Designated Health Information Exchange (CRISP) for public health and clinical purposes
- ► EHN may not charge a fee to health care providers, health care payors, or to CRISP
- ► CRISP is required to develop and implement supporting policies and procedures for EHNs

Drivers for Maryland Law



- ▶ Expand statewide public health capabilities including:
 - Facilitating a State health improvement program
 - Mitigating public health emergencies
 - Improving patient safety
 - Offering health care providers a more comprehensive view into patients' care

Informal Draft Amendments



- ▶ In the fall 2023, the MHCC, CRISP, and certain EHNs explored implementation approaches
- ▶ Public comments were solicited in May 2024 on informal draft amendments to COMAR 10.25.07, Certification of Electronic Health Networks and Medical Care Electronic Claims Clearinghouses
- ▶ 15 unique comments on EHN reporting of electronic health care transactions
 - Potential uses
 - Clarification of reporting requirements/options
 - Timelines
