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HB 857 Proposed Amendments

- Strikes introduced text
- prevents carriers from requiring MOC for credentialing, participation, or reimbursement or establish different rates based on MOC.
- prevents hospitals from requiring MOC as a condition of credentialing or maintaining privileges.

HB 857 Proposed Amendments

- Amends the definition of Board Certified in section 14-101(c) of Health Occupations to
 - treats initial certification the same as current certification; and
 - Add NBPAS to the list of approved organizations

Note that section 14-101.1 in current law allows the Board of Physicians to add a new certifying board through board action.

“Board Certification” in Title 14, Health Occupations

- Licensure after multiple exam failures
- Disciplinary action
- Public Profiles
- Representation to Public

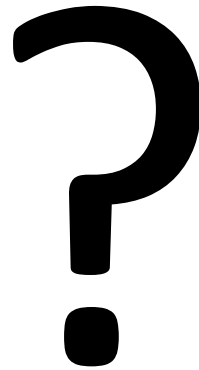


Other States
