

Questions to Guide Development of Recommendations on Palliative Care in Maryland

- 1. State of Palliative Care (PC) Services:
 - Where are PC services currently provided?
 - Which settings provide PC? Which settings do not?
 - What is needed for more widespread availability of PC?
- 2. Gaps in the Provision of PC Services:
 - Which geographic areas do not provide PC services?
 - What other types of gaps exist: financial, demographic, diagnostic?
 - What is needed to improve access to PC?
 - How can these gaps be addressed?
- 3. Opportunities for Collaboration:
 - Which organizations provide PC or promote the development of PC?
 - How can PC be expanded?
 - What models in other states have worked?
- 4. Feasibility of Financial Support for PC:
 - What is the current state of coverage for PC under private insurance?
 - What is the current state of coverage for PC under Medicaid?
 - What is the current state of coverage for PC under Medicare/Medicare Advantage?
 - What models have worked in other states?
- 5. Plan for Ongoing Data Collection:
 - What lessons were learned from the Maryland survey on PC?
 - How can the survey be modified to ensure fuller participation?
 - What models have worked in other states?
- 6. Engagement Strategies for Public Education:
 - What does the public know about PC?
 - What has worked in other states to engage public education?
 - Which stakeholders in Maryland are best equipped to provide public education?
 - How does this relate to professional education to improve referrals to PC?
